Despite the recognised relevance of graffiti as a historical source, key aspects of their study, such as documentation, have not yet been sufficiently implemented. This lack affects various aspects beyond the purely scientific one. The DIGIGRAF project filled this gap by defining good practices for the documentation, analysis, and study of the Cypriot Graffiti Heritage. The project represented a relevant advancement in the state-of-the-art graffiti study by providing a defined and tested methodology of reference at local and international levels. Furthermore, the definition of good practices in the study of Cypriot graffiti will strongly enhance our specific knowledge about this phenomenon, establishing its relevance as a multidisciplinary source and providing Cultural Heritage with new data.
